

PHCF: STORY & PICTORIAL VIEW OF KANJUKI PRIMARY SCHOOL DURING THE FIRST INTERACTION WITH THE COMMUNITY - KAMILA SUB COUNTY – LUWERO DISTRICT



Kanjuki primary school P.5 Girls telling their stories in a school with no water neither built urinal places (No safe places in times of need)



The state of classrooms with majority of pupils under ten years of age



Calling for assembly to address the pupils and share their needs and concerns



The pupils walk barefooted and majority of them cover 5 kilo meters' to and fro to reach the school and back home. Below a team from PHCF together with the school Director address the children.



The nearby source of water is a borehole which serves 5 villages in a 3 kilo meters journey from the school. The long queue at the borehole do not favors pupils to have water on time; solution is to find an alternative source - which is an open surface dam shared with human and animals. The distance is too long, estimated to 2 kilo meters' walk.



The burden for water affects more the children and women as can be seen from the photos below.



The Potter's Heart Child Foundation made a number of engagements and consultations with the local leaders. Below is the dialogue meetings with the local leaders and elders at the school premises. PHCF donated liquid detergents and sanitary pads to the girls in need.
